<b>Context for Delivery:</b> Having children at a young age can be harmful to a young woman's health and well-being and can severely limit her own education and career prospects, as well as those of her children.  The most recent data released in July 2008 tells us that as at the end of March 2006, the rate of conceptions was 46.6 per 1,000 population of 15-17 year olds. This is higher than the rate for England which is 40.6 per 1,000.
